

## New Testing Options for Seniors and Grads 2 Be

New Testing Options for Students Required to Take the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) will allow students additional ways to meet graduation requirements\*\*

**Students who began ninth grade before July 1, 2014**, must meet their course requirements and their current testing requirements, the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT), to graduate. Students may also use new assessment options to meet graduation requirements. This means that students who must pass the OGT may:

- 1. **Current:** Use old graduation requirements by passing the OGT;
- 2. New: Use new graduation requirements for students who began ninth grade on or after July 1, 2014:
  - Earn a total of <u>18 Graduation Points</u> across all end-of-course tests;
  - Earn a remediation-free score on the ACT or SAT; or
  - Earn a composite score of 13 on the WorkKeys and an <u>approved industry-recognized</u> credential; or
- 3. New: Use new testing options to fulfill old graduation requirements by subject (see table below for the new options).

\*These test scores are the remediation-free scores set by Ohio's university presidents. These scores are subject to change. \*\*House Bill 64 and the Ohio Revised Code require the State Board of Education to adopt new rules permitting a student who began ninth grade before July 1, 2014, choices for graduation that incorporate new graduation options. The State Board voted to adopt the new rules at its December 2015 board meeting. The new rules became effective on Jan. 1, 2016.
