Below you will find just a few books with Native American (First Nation) characters. For more book selections, visit the clickable links.




Clack! Clack! Smack! A Cherokee Stick Ball Story By: Traci Sorell

Vann stumbles, and he tries and fails to score. How can he help his teammates win?



Each participant will also have three one-on-one phone sessions with the group leader to make the information *neally* work for their families.

- 1. Go to our website at www.ccsoh.us and click on the Students and Families Families tab.

- 4. Log in using your USER NAME AND PASSWORD

HOW TO ACTIVATE THE PARENT PORTAL

Each parent/guardian has their own_personalized Activation Code.

1. Go to our website at www.ccsoh.us and click on the Students and Families Families tab.

- 2. Click on the **PARENT PORTAL box** at the bottom of the page.
- 3. Click on the button that says **NEW USER ACTIVATION**.
- 4. Enter your **ACTIVATION CODE** (contact your school to obtain one if needed). We know it's long that helps keep the data secure so type carefully. Once the code has been activated, it can't be used again.
- 5. Follow the prompts to set up your username/password and to add a recovery email address.

FORGOT USERNAME/PASSWORD

6. Click on **EXISTING USER** in the Portal, then click **FORGOT USERNAME/PASSWORD**, and the information will be sent to the email used to set up the account. If you no longer have access to the email you used when setting up the account, please send a picture ID and your student's name and date of birth to <u>parentportalaccess@columbus.k12.oh.us</u>.
