WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL OUTSTANDING:

Cedarwood is proud to have received multiple awards for the outstanding educational excellence happening in our building. Some of our awards include, Ohio Association of Elementary School Administrators (OAESA) 2025 Hall of Fame School, School of Momentum award by the Ohio Department of Education & Workforce, and we are recognized for our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS).

Cedarwood Elementary is a Project Adventure school where students learn through hands-on, inquiry-based activities that build trust, communication, and problem-solving skills. Weekly sessions with the PE teacher include climbing walls and obstacle courses. Students also take part in field trips, including overnight camping at Heartland Outdoor Retreat, visits to art museums, and musical performances.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES/SPORTS:

Fourth and fifth grade choir, band, and string ensemble, chess club, Walk-A-Thon, Read-A-Thon, Literacy and Math/Science Nights, safety patrol, peer tutors, Reading Buddies, Battle of the Books, and adventure field trips. There is a Project Adventure fee.

SPECIALTY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/CURRICULUM:

Reading, math, writing, science, social studies, health, art, vocal music, instrumental music, and PE. The Project Adventure program involves cooperative learning experiences based on trust, communication, cooperation, problem-solving, risk and challenge.
