With three outdoor playgrounds and an on-site community garden, students have space to play, grow, and explore. Programs like Comfortable Cafeteria help students build friendships and feel a strong sense of belonging. From author visits and hands-on field trips to surprise guests like OSU football players, learning at Moler is engaging, exciting, and student-centered. The school also hosts two YMCA Head Start classrooms, providing high-quality Pre-K for children ages 3–5 in the 43207 zip code—setting the foundation for lifelong learning.

# SPECIALTY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/CURRICULUM:

Moler uses the Common Core State Standards for reading and math. We use HMH into reading, iReady math, and Achieve 3000. In addition to language arts and math, Moler offers science, social studies, physical education, adaptive physical education, vocal music, instrumental music, and art.

READING PROGRAM: Guided literacy in grades K-6. Students will participate in differentiated guided reading groups.

### **STUDENT ACTIVITES/SPORTS:**

Moler offers a variety of programs that spark curiosity, build leadership, and keep students growing beyond the classroom. From extended learning tutoring to scouts, and Chess Club, students stay active, engaged, and connected. DRIVEN Mentorship Programs for both male and female students provide guidance, support, and role models to help them thrive in school and in life.

#### **FAMILY SUPPORT AND RESOURCES:**

Moler provides multiple opportunities and forums for which parents to be involved at school. A few of those opportunities are parent workshops, welcome back ice cream social, monthly parent meetings, open house, annual black history events, parent/teacher conferences and linkage with community resources.

#### **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS:**

Moler Elementary is supported by a strong network of community partners that enrich learning, wellness, and family engagement.
