WELCOME MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL

Welcome back Briggs Families and Students. I am honored to serve as your principal for another school year. The first day of school for students is Wednesday, August 21, 2024. I want every student to be present on the first day of school and thereafter. We will host a family and staff meet and greet for incoming 9th grade students and new students on Thursday, August 15, 2024 from 6pm-7:30pm.

My main objectives this year are to continue to provide a safe learning environment and strengthen the existing academic and Social Emotional Learning structures which include our Bruin STRONG PBIS program, student Power of One leadership program, Student Led Restorative Practices. My other main objectives are to increase our community partners and alumni involvement, increase graduation rate, increase daily student attendance, academic performance on all state assessments, and student participation in our CCP(College Career Credit Plus) and AP courses, and student extracurricular activities. During the 2023-24 school year the percent of students passing the Algebra Ohio State Achievement test increased by 6% for the second year in a row, which makes our math algebra OST passing rate the 4th highest in the district. Attendance House Bill 410

It is important for your child to attend school every day. When your student misses a significant amount of school, even if the absences are excused, the child misses critical instruction time and learning opportunities. This often has long-term, negative effects on a child, such as lower achievement and a greater chance of not graduating on time. A new state law defines excessive absence and truancy: Excessive absence: a student misses 38 or more hours of school in a single month, or 65 or more hours in one school year, with or without a legitimate excuse. Truancy: a student is absent from school without legitimate excuse for 30 or more consecutive hours, 42 or more hours in one school month, or 72 or more hours in a school year.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

We are charged with preparing students for college and careers. This dress code aligns with this goal in that it prepares students to understand the level of dress expected in these areas. Some highlighted areas of the full CCS dress code (found on the CCS website) are:

Students must be appropriately covered at all times =

- No bare midriffs or shirts/dresses with straps thinner than 2 fingers in width.
- No halter/tube tops or dresses.
- No sleepwear or blankets / No Gang related apparel
- No t-shirts with drug or sexualized images or statements are permitted.
- Hoodies and hats are not to be worn inside the building.
- Shorts and skirts should be long enough so that when the arm is completely extended the hem reaches past the student's fingertips.
- No sagging pants, pants with chains or spikes on belts or spikes worn as jewelry, or ripped pants above the fingertips.

Guide to Student Success Handbook

The 2024-25 Student Guide to Success is now available. If your scholar has a form on file and he or she is remaining at the same school this year, a new form will not have to be submitted. Arrival/Dismissal Procedure

1. All students must enter Briggs at the rear of the building as early as 7:00 am – please be cautious and drive slowly around the school as both staff and students are crossing the drive.
2. All students will be required to go through a security check. to remove all metal objects from his/her person (e.g., belt buckles, jewelry, keys, coins, batteries, electronic devices, etc.) and to place the metal objects and any bags, backpacks, briefcases, knapsacks, purses, or parcels on a table. 3. Breakfast is served from 7:00-7:25 am and school begins promptly at 7:30.
4. All students should be at school on time. If a student arrives after 10:00 am, a parent or guardian must sign student in at the attendance office (front doors) with a written excuse.
5. If you need to pick your student up early for an appointment, please do your best to do so before 2:00 so that you will be able to exit – after this the buses will block the exit for the safety of students and so that the buses can exit promptly.
6. Students are released at 2:30 pm and are to exit the building unless they are here for an extra-curricular activity and supervised by a Briggs coach or staff member.
